# Acting III Course Syllabus- Fall 2019

#### **Course Description**

Acting III is an acting technique intensive overview designed to educate students on the techniques of various acting coaches and teachers. Building upon the foundational skills developed in Acting I and Acting II, this class is open to only juniors who have taken both of the aforementioned course, with little exception to sophomores who have also met the prerequisites. Techniques of Kristin Linklater, Constantin Stanislavski, Sanford Meisner, Lee Strasberg, Stella Adler, Tadashi Suzuki, and more will be studied in overview. Students will perform different monologues in all styles studied and the semester will conclude with a performance of *The Crucible* by Arthur Miller in which students will explore a specific acting technique with the character(s) they are cast.

## **Course Objectives**

- ★ Students will be able to discover and use different ways of communicating meaning and perspective both to their peers and to an audience.
- ★ Students will be able to share and debate personal ideas with a group to create a uniform performance.
- ★ Students will be able to examine and understand how their personal beliefs and attributes affect the way they approach and interpret drama and theatre work.
- ★ Students will be able to discover characters, types, and so forth that work for them as an actor.
- ★ Students will be able to apply knowledge they have learned about themselves to choose 5-7 appropriate monologues.
- ★ Students will be able to describe, understand, and demonstrate the Linklater Vocal Technique.
- ★ Students will be able to apply Linklater breathing techniques to monologue and/or scene work.
- ★ Students will be able to develop a warm up employing Linklater vocal technique and be able to teach it to their peers.
- ★ Students will be able to research an Acting Master's technique with a group.
- ★ Students will be able to understand the technique of the Acting Master they research.
- ★ Students will be able to create a group lesson plan to teach their peers' about the Acting Master they studied.
- ★ Students will be able to facilitate a group lesson plan to teach their peers about the Acting Master they studied.

- \* Students will be able to identify the different elements of each Acting Master presented by their peers.
- ★ Students will be able to compare and contrast the benefits and perspectives of each Acting Master's method.
- ★ Students will be able to synthesize all they have learned about acting techniques into a believable and sustainable performance in **The Crucible**.
- ★ Students will be able to apply knowledge of technical elements to their production of **The Crucible** to develop a deeper performance.

## **Attendance Policy**

Students are required to attend class every day. Each student may have three excused absences. Should they miss a class, they must have doctor's note or guardian note that is <u>signed by a</u> <u>guardian</u> for family emergencies for it to count as an excused absence. Any absence that is not excused or exceeds the student's allotted three excused absences will result in a point being deducted from the student's participation grade.

#### The Crucible

The last unit of study involves putting on a class production of *The Crucible* by Arthur Miller. Every student in the class will be cast in the show *and* have a production/technical team role. This performance functions as the student's final grade for the semester, thus attendance is imperative. Students may only have **one excused** absence during this rehearsal process, and may not miss the Dress Rehearsal or any of the performances in which they are cast. For more information on the specific days of this, please see the "Schedule" section of this syllabus.

## **Dress Code Policy**

Almost every day, we will be moving around and on the floor. Students must wear clothing they feel comfortable moving in and appropriate to move around in. Furthermore, students must adhere to school policies when dressing for class. Should students break dress code policy or wear clothing that prohibits or is inappropriate for movement, they will receive a 0 for participation points that day.

## **Technology Policy**

Phones are only allowed with specific and explicit permission from the teacher. Without this permission, phones will be confiscated and given to the main office. Anyone found using their phones for purposes not relevant to the class will also be subject to confiscation.

Computers and tablets are not allowed for note taking unless accommodations are made with arrangements with the teacher. COmputers may be used for sound and research purposes during appropriate times.

#### Late Work

All assignments should be turned in on time. However, life happens and assignments sometimes end up being turned in late. Should one of these situations arise, the student should inform me that their assignment is going to be late *at least 24 hours in advance* of the deadline in order for the assignment to adhere to the following grading policy:

#### 1 day (24 hours) late- grade decreases half a letter grade

- > For each additional day, the student will be deducted half a letter grade.
- ➤ After seven days, the assignment will no longer be accepted and the student will receive a zero.

Should the student not inform me that their assignment will be late 24 hours in advance of the deadline, the assignment will adhere to the following grading policy:

#### 1 day (24 hours) late- grade decreases a full letter grade

- > For each additional day, the student will be deducted a full letter grade.
- ➤ After three days, the assignment will no longer be accepted and e student will receive a zero

The purpose of this policy is to help students strengthen their accountability. Deadlines are important, but I realize students have other classes and other life obligations that may get in the way. With this policy, I hope to help students learn to plan ahead, know what assignments they have going on, and plan their time accordingly, only turning in assignments late when they know they will not have time to finish it on time, rather that simple procrastination.
